## 2015 Annual Report: Program Outcomes and Community Outreach

## Breast, Colon & Skin Cancer Screenings

In order to address community health needs, we provide screening events for individuals who are uninsured or underinsured. We provide screening opportunities year round at community health fairs and corporate wellness events so we can educate and provide preventative services to those who may not otherwise receive the care they need.
