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Facility Expansion GRAND OPENING

Building On a Century of Caring

On February 24, 2021, we held the grand opening for our \$56 million expansion project. The 82,000-square-foot, three story addition increased the hospital's overall size to approximately 300,000 square feet.

Patients can now recover in spacious private rooms with family-friendly touches, floor-to-ceiling windows that allow healing natural light to flow in, and digital smart boards that allow patients to interact with their care team, and stay in touch with loved ones 24/7.

This expansion is about much more than growth and modernization. It's really about connecting people to expert healthcare and compassionate providers. In short, it's about transforming the patient experience.

- 32 private & spacious, family-friendly rooms
- Acuity adjustable rooms integrated with technology to provide ICU care, if needed
- Integrated nurse call system for quicker response

BIRTHING CENTER

- 11 private birthing suites with spa-like touches (6 labor and delivery rooms, 3 postpartum rooms, 2 recovery rooms)
- C-section viewing room
- Fully secure unit and infant protection system

WELLNESS CENTER

- 10,000 sq. ft. Wellness Center
- Large gym and indoor walking track
- Community rooms and cooking demonstration lab for wellness education

Free Onsite Vaccine Clinics for Businesses

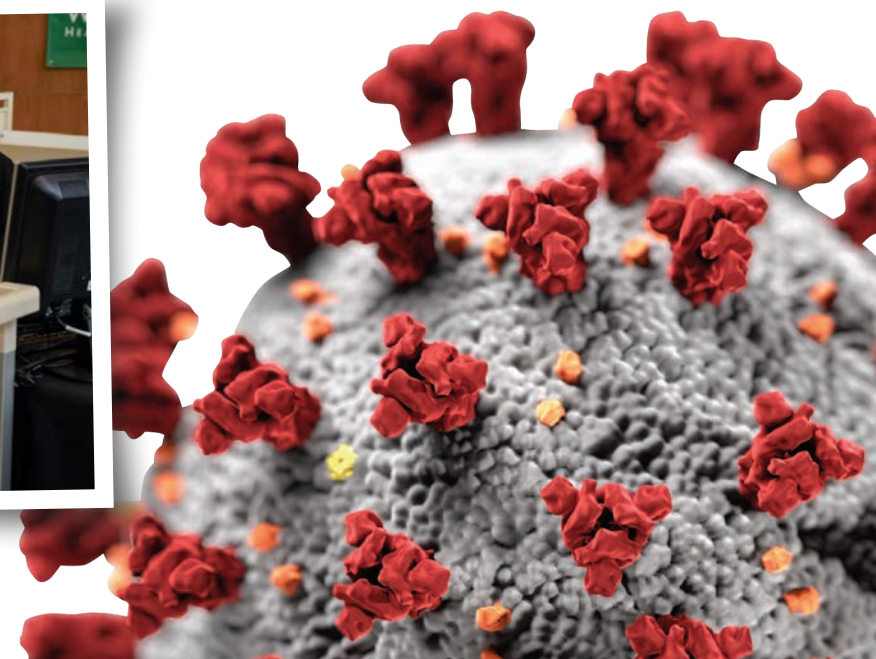
At-Home COVID-19 Testing Kits

At Wayne HealthCare, our number one priority is the health and safety of you and your family. Through a partnership with the State of Ohio and Nationwide Children's Hospital Emergency Preparedness team, Wayne HealthCare received 2,448 BinaxNow At-Home Covid Tests to help fight against the spread of COVID-19. An internal hospital team coordinated with local factories, schools and businesses to distribute all of the kits throughout the course of the year.



Post-COVID Rehabilitation Program

In collaboration with the Wellness Center, Wayne HealthCare established a Post-COVID Rehabilitation Program for community members affected by COVID. The program is an 8 to 12 week exercise program designed for individuals experiencing the ongoing effects of COVID-19. The goal is to help manage and improve symptoms, build strength and endurance, improve functionality with activities of daily living, and improve quality of life.



Impressive OPERATION

Governor DeWine Visits Darke County Vaccination Clinic

Ohio Governor Mike DeWine, joined by First Lady Fran DeWine, visited Greenville in March to witness Darke County's vaccination efforts to combat COVID-19. Wayne HealthCare, Family Health Services, the Darke County Health Department, and Reid Hospital joined together in a mutual effort to provide vaccinations for the public. The clinic was located at the Reid Health Building in Greenville.

The Governor and his wife toured the operation, visited with those getting vaccinated, handed out homemade buckeyes, and praised the collaboration involved in hosting the clinic. DeWine noted, "This is a very impressive operation. This is really the community coming together."

On the day of DeWine's visit, local healthcare workers were joined by members of the Ohio National Guard to vaccinate Darke County citizens. The clinic dispensed 400 doses of the vaccine and accommodated approximately 100 people per hour.



Award-Winning CARE

Wayne HealthCare Earned a CMS 5-Star Quality Rating Two Years in a Row!



Wayne HealthCare earned a **5-star quality rating** in 2020 and 2021 from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) based on 57 quality measures across seven categories based on performance, safety and patient satisfaction. It is the highest rating any hospital can earn and **ranks Wayne HealthCare among the top 14 percent in the nation.** Of 3,355 hospitals nationwide, only 455 scored five stars in 2021. In the Miami Valley, Wayne HealthCare is the only independent hospital to have received five stars.

Commitment to Quality

This achievement would not have been possible without the dedication and commitment of the entire Wayne HealthCare team working together for the betterment of the patient. Hospital leaders and staff prioritized the continuous improvement of processes and outcomes, which led to State and National recognition for our involvement in National Quality Programs. We are pleased to have been recognized for more than 5 areas of improvement related to patient safety and quality in 2021.

Wayne HealthCare Telehealth Services

Teleneurology–NEUROne

A board-certified neurologist assists in the diagnosis and treatment of nonemergency neurological conditions.

TeleIntensivist

A board-certified intensivist, who has advanced training and experience in treating the complex health needs of critically ill patients, is virtually available around-the-clock to assist in managing patients with higher acuity needs.

TeleStroke

Board-certified neurologists work with the staff at Wayne HealthCare to ensure rapid evaluation and treatment after a stroke to maximize rehabilitation and recovery for patients.

TeleEEG

Board-certified neurologists diagnose and assist in monitoring seizures and other brain disorders.

Expanded TELEHEALTH SERVICES

Teleneurology Services Now Offered

Wayne HealthCare and Premier Health have expanded their telehealth partnership to include **teleneurology services, called NEUROne, for patients who have nonemergency neurological conditions.**

Private and secure NEUROne video conferencing allows patients, family, and the bedside care team to see and speak with Premier Health's Clinical Neurosciences Institute neurologists in real time. This collaboration can optimize diagnosis and treatment by providing a high level of specialized care. It also allows for the treatment of a far greater range of neurological conditions than in the past.

NEUROne is suitable for patients with general neurological conditions, including:

- Headache
- Seizure
- Stroke
- Neuro-muscular disorders

NEUROne is in addition to Wayne HealthCare's other telehealth services including TeleIntensivist, TeleStroke and TeleEEG. These consultative services allows residents of Darke County and the surrounding area to stay close to home and still receive a highly specialized level of care.

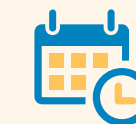

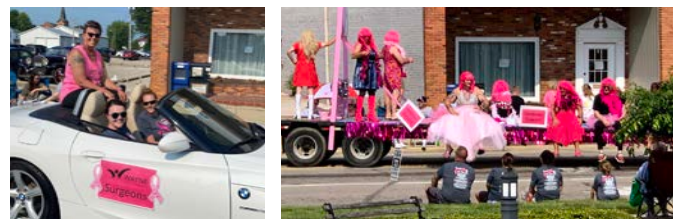
The Gauntlet Mud Run

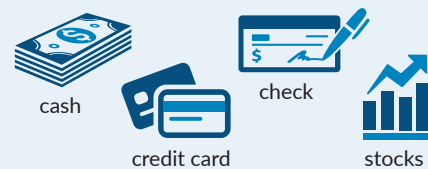

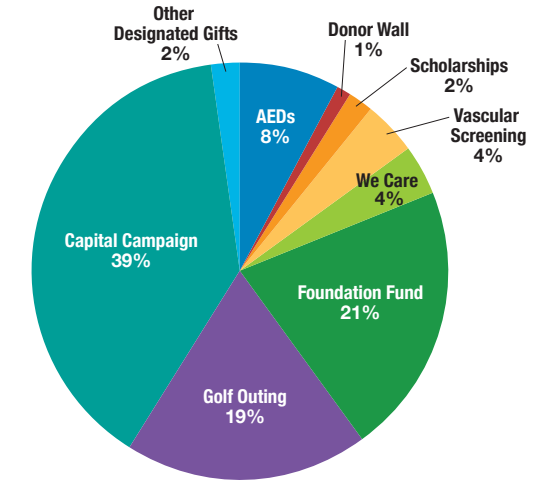

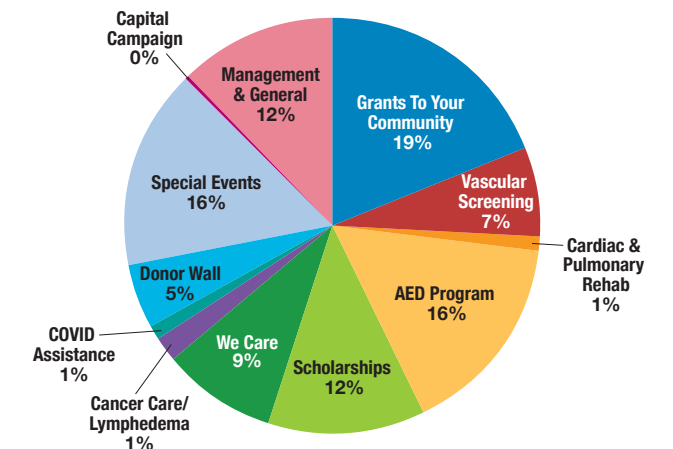

HEART HEALTH PROGRAMS

Vascular Screening Program

Each February, Wayne HealthCare shines a light on offering discounted vascular screenings in celebration of "Pump Month." Events such as 4 Miles for Heart & Health, Heart Art featuring Drab to Fab and Wine & Chocolates assist with funding. Since the program's inception in late fall of 2016, a total of **1,729 discounted or free screenings** have been provided, offering a **savings of \$46,024**. In 2021, **303 screenings** were provided, offering a **savings of \$8,275**.

These non-invasive, preventative vascular ultrasounds can help identify risks that could lead to a future stroke or heart attack. On average 1 in 3 patients have a result that shows a need for follow-up care. The Foundation's goal is to change outcomes for the better and ultimately save lives.

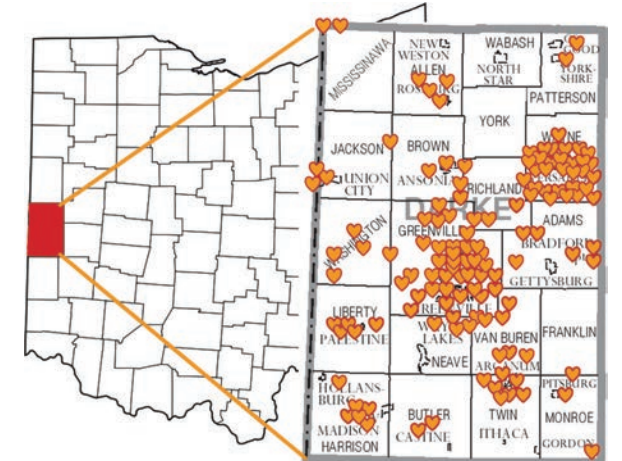

A maintenance program is also available for safe and timely replacement of pads and batteries. 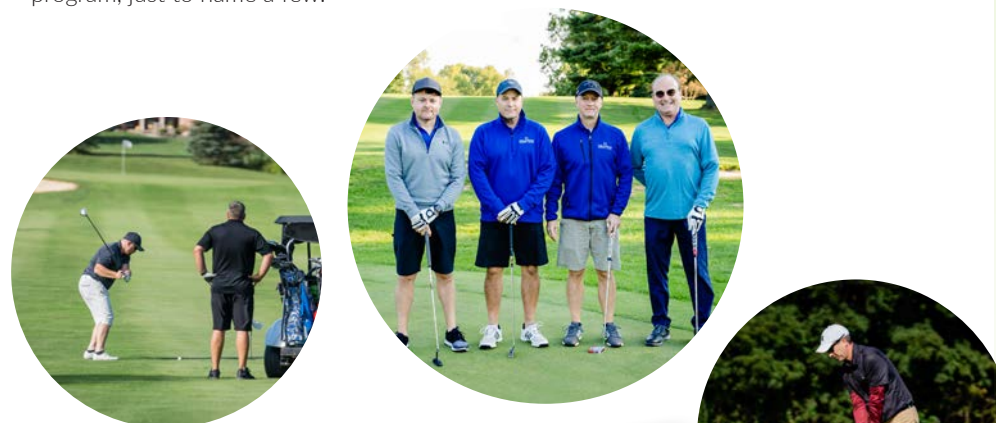

Upcoming PROGRAMS IN 2022

The Wayne HealthCare Foundation is happy to serve our community and hospital by partnering with these special programs coming in 2022!

Clinical Oncology Exercise Program

A new Clinical Oncology Exercise Program will begin in spring 2022. It is a 12-week program that will be held in our new Wellness Center for those going through cancer treatments or those in remission/recovery. The goal of the program is to prevent or reduce side effects of cancer treatment and improve quality of life during and after treatment. The program is designed to help with pain management and improve functionality with activities of daily living affected by treatment. The Foundation will fund most of the program so it can be offered at just \$25/participant.



Mental Health and Wellness Programs

The Foundation is partnering with Wayne HealthCare and Family Health to provide financial assistance for testing for communicable diseases among our mental health population to ensure they receive proper care and to help with pharmaceutical costs. Additionally, the Foundation is working with the Emergency Department and other groups to provide hygiene kits and mental health resources for patients.



Transportation Patient Assistance Fund

The Foundation is partnering with Greenville Transit System (GTS) and Spirit Medical to assist patients with safe transportation home from the hospital or to other facilities, as well as providing financial assistance for gas cards.



SafeHaven Baby Box

The Foundation is partnering with Radiant Lighthouse, Greenville Township EMS and other community donors to assist with a SafeHaven Baby Box, which gives mothers/families in crisis a place to safely, securely, and anonymously drop-off their newborn if they need to be placed with alternative care. The Baby Box is the first of its kind in Darke County and will be located at the Greenville Township EMS building.



There are many other organizations in Darke County that provide a safe haven for families in crisis to bring children for alternate placement if they are unable to care for them or need to keep them safe from harm.
